The History of MIHA

The History of the Michigan Interscholastic Horsemanship Association

By attending the MIHA State Championships, you are part of a tradition more than fifty years in the making. While the earliest days of the MIHA are not fully documented, its roots trace back to 1968, when an equine census revealed more than 10,000 horses in Oakland County. Inspired by this, Ed Chezy, Kelly Lawrence, and Carmi Edwards proposed a school-sponsored horsemanship program to the Huron Valley School Board. To gauge community interest, the board recommended hosting a horse show. In 1972, the first "Father's Day Show" was organized by the newly formed horsemanship committee. Using a portable arena and sound system in front of Milford High School, the show drew 1,200 spectators, 600 entries, and generated a profit of \$1,700. The overwhelming success demonstrated the need for a formal educational horsemanship program. Soon after, a proposal was presented to the Board of Education, which included designating 20 acres of land adjacent to Milford High School for horsemanship activities, annual shows, and the interscholastic equestrian team program. The proposal passed, and with it, the foundation of MIHA was laid.

The first interscholastic equestrian competition took place in the fall of 1973 at Bogie Lake Country Club, featuring five schools; Hartland, Howell, Holly, Fenton, and Milford and 30 to 40 riders. Though no one recalls who won, what everyone remembered was the excitement and camaraderie, ensuring the program's continuation. By 1976, the program had expanded statewide and officially became the Michigan Interscholastic Horsemanship Association.

That same year, on May 16, the first MIHA State Championship was held at Oak Ridge Stables in White Lake Township, attracting nearly 600 spectators. Romeo High School claimed the inaugural title. Coaches and leaders such as Chuck Schroder, Gerald Fuller, Wanda Keech (Brighton), and Virginia Bennett (Pinckney) were instrumental in establishing the program's foundation.

As MIHA grew, divisions were added to accommodate the increasing number of teams and riders. In 1978, "A" and "B" divisions were created to separate larger and smaller teams. By 1984, MIHA had expanded to six districts with 678 riders, and by 1987, 11 districts with 935 riders on 120 teams. A "C" Division for very small teams was added in 1992. By 1994, MIHA had grown to 14 districts, 173 teams, and 1,118 riders statewide.

In 2004, a Junior Division was piloted for riders in grades 6–8 and officially adopted in 2006. As participation continued to grow, Regional competitions were introduced in 2005 to manage the size of the State Championship. A "D" Division for teams with two or fewer riders was added in 2006, and in 2017, eligibility expanded to include 5th graders.

The MIHA has also emphasized educational opportunities. In 2019, under the leadership of former Chairman Marc DeLisle and former 1st Chair Lauren Fetner, and in partnership with Lighthouse and the Michigan Horse Council, scholarship awards were increased to \$11,000, furthering MIHA's commitment to supporting student athletes both in and out of the arena.

From its humble beginnings at a local high school show to the statewide championships you see today, the MIHA continues to grow and thrive, providing young equestrians with opportunities to learn, compete, and demonstrate sportsmanship for generations to come.

Code of Conduct

To ensure fairness, safety, and efficiency, all participants, coaches, and spectators are expected to adhere to the following guidelines. Rule citations are noted where applicable.

Arena Access: Parents, spectators, and coaches are not permitted inside the arena during competition. (Rule Book: Article XII, Section G)

Show staff and announcers are responsible for facilitating class flow. Riders must be ready at the gate for their class. It is the rider's responsibility to be on time. Abuse of show staff will not be tolerated and may result in disciplinary action against the individual or their team. (Rule Book: Article XII, Section G, K)

Judge Communication: Parents, spectators, riders, and coaches may not approach or communicate with judges. (*Rule Book: Article XII, Section G*) Only show staff are authorized to communicate with judges.

Class Entries and Protests: Only a coach with proper MIHA identification may add or drop classes. (Rule Book: Article VIII, Section B)

All add/drop requests must be filed with the Show Office prior to the commencement of the first division of the class immediately preceding the class in question.

For the first scheduled class of the day, all add/drop requests must be filed no later than thirty (30) minutes prior to the commencement of the first division of that class.

Only a coach may file a protest. Protests must: Be submitted in writing, be filed in the show office prior to the commencement of the next class in the division. And be accompanied by a cash payment. (Rule Book: Article XIV, Section K, p. 23)

Show staff will communicate directly with judges regarding all protests.

Announcer Communication: Parents, spectators, riders, and coaches may not communicate with announcers while a class is in progress. (*Rule Book: Article XII, Section G*)


Tack and Apparel Inspections: Inspections are for rider protection and fairness, ensuring winners succeed on their merit rather than being disqualified for missing or incorrect items.

Items approved at Districts or Regionals are not automatically acceptable at State Finals. Riders must ensure compliance. (Rule Book: Article XIII, Section F)

General Rules of Conduct: No coaching from the sidelines by parents/spectators. (*Rule Book: Article XII, Section G*) Riding double or riding with only a halter/lead strap is prohibited. (*Rule Book: Article XII, Section G*) Misconduct—including smoking, alcohol use, foul language, unsportsmanlike behavior, or mistreatment of animals—will not be tolerated. (*Rule Book: Article XII, Sections G & K*)

Facility Respect: All attendees must respect the Midland County Fairgrounds and adhere to its rules as outlined in this program. Please help keep the grounds clean and safe for all. (*Rule Book: Article XII, Section G*)

Timeliness: Classes will not be held for late riders. (*Rule Book: Article XII, Section G*) If you miss your designated order of go, your slot will be forfeited. Riders may only switch order with teammates, and gate staff must be notified of the change immediately. (*Rule Book: Article VIII, Section D* Punctuality and preparedness are essential to keeping the show on schedule. We appreciate your cooperation!



Midland County Fairground Rules

(These rules will be strictly enforced during the MIHA State Championships)

1. Dogs and Companion Animals

Dogs and companion animals are permitted in the camping area only. Animals found outside the camping area will result in immediate expulsion without refund. No exceptions. Please clean up after your animals. Failure to comply may result in the removal of all dogs from future events in addition to fines.

2. Horse Stalls

Only shavings and manure may be left in stalls.

Prohibited materials include straw, Styrofoam, wood pellets, artificial bedding, or trash.

Violators will be fined \$75.00 per stall.

3. Barns and Stalls

Stall decorations are encouraged; however, **no staples, nails, or permanent alterations** are permitted in stalls, barns, or on the grounds. Any damage will be assessed to the team responsible.

4. Horses on Grounds

Horses are not permitted on grassy areas or in campgrounds. This includes riding, lunging, or hand-walking, loading into trailers. Violation will result in immediate expulsion from the fairgrounds. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their horses.

5. Camping

Camping is permitted in designated campsites only.

Horses are not allowed in camping areas during the show or during loading. Violators will be asked to leave.

Do not plug campers into barns or other buildings.

Empty trailers and vehicles may not be parked in campsites and must use designated parking areas.

Water hookups are not guaranteed at campsites. Please do not leave water hoses attached beyond initial fills.

Please refer to camping diagram below for parking instructions; anyone on the incorrect spot number will need to move.

6. Clean-Up

Exhibitors and teams are responsible for cleaning up after themselves and their horses. All stall decorations must be completely removed at the conclusion of the show.

7. Parking

Vehicles may not be parked in empty campsites or around barns or fire lanes. Unauthorized vehicles are subject to towing at the team's expense. **No exceptions.**

8. Restricted Areas

The north and northwestern sections of the fairgrounds are strictly off-limits.

This includes the area behind Barn 22, near the main fair office, and the area north of the fence by the campgrounds. Presence in these areas may result in removal from the fairgrounds.

9. Motorized Vehicles

ATVs and UTVs are not permitted on the fairgrounds due to liability concerns. Golf carts are available for rent on a

first-come, first-served basis.
